Let's celebrate the return to live music-making in 2022, while respecting the real concerns many people still have around COVID transmission. I suspect that many venues and music organisations will continue with 1 metre distancing for some time; and some people will prefer to continue to wear masks when mixing with other people in enclosed spaces. Many thanks to Philip Redfern and Margaret West for their work in getting the Early Music Choir up and running this term, starting with a Zoom session in January, followed up by an in-person session in February and the one-day choral workshop planned for 12th March. Vickie Hobson has been working to set up some viol - and viols and voices - sessions between 10th and 13th March, when we are delighted to welcome as tutors two leading professional viol players, Ali Kinder and Ibi Aziz. Ali and Ibi will both be performing with the Chelys Consort and mezzo soprano Helen Charlston at the Georgian Concert Society on Saturday 12th March, in a programme featuring works by William Byrd - a real treat for early music lovers! If you fancy trying out a viol, we are hoping to include a "Try a Viol" session in the mix. Viols will be provided for the session, and you don't need any previous instrumental experience, just the ability to read music.


Stop Press!

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Shifting Shades of Gray : A Musical Dynasty in Mediaeval Aberdeen D James Ross

An Introduction and a Link

For some time now it has been known that the Renaissance Scottish composer Robert Carver spent most of his life at Scone Abbey, a fact confirmed by the surprise rediscovery some twenty years ago of a Chartulary (explored in D James Ross : *Robert Carver, Canon of Scone : New Perspectives on the Scottish Renaissance composer* in *Notis Musycall : Essays on Music and Scottish Culture in Honour of Kenneth Elliott* (Musica Scotica Trust Glasgow, 2005) pp95-114.) However, the discovery by Dr John Durkan a few years earlier that Carver had a maternal uncle in Aberdeen turned the spotlight firmly on Aberdeen.

It features St Nicholas Parish Church (the 'Great Church') surrounded by its cemetery, the song school at its west end (i), and to its north-east, the Guest Row (d), all associated with Carver's relatives, and very much as they would have known them in the late 1400s and early 1500s.

The ambitious Aberdeen Registers Online project (full details appear in my online paper) allows the extensive City Registers 1395-1511 to be studied online. So when rehearsals of the Mass '*Cantate*' (attrib. Robert Carver) with my choral group Musick Fyne stalled before Christmas due to Covid restrictions, I found myself with time on my hands, and decided to resume my search for Carver's Aberdonian relatives.

In the event, my quest led in a number of unexpected directions. One cherished theory of mine was undermined, but on the other hand I was able to add several musicians to Carver's family tree, in effect identifying a remarkable musical dynasty in Mediaeval Aberdeen. A dash of colour was added to rather dry accounts of property transactions by the young composer's inheritance of a whisky still! And there is drama aplenty, as some musical careers flourish, while others are cut tragically short.
